Refugees under UNHCR mandate

Of the 10.5 million refugees under UNHCR's mandate as of 2012, the largest numbers were being hosted by Pakistan (1,638,500), Iran (868,200), Germany (589,700), Kenya (564,900), Syria (476,500) and Ethiopia (376,400).

Developing countries hosted over 80% of the world's refugees, compared to 70% ten years ago.

Australia was ranked 49th, hosting 30,083 refugees, or 0.3 per cent of the global total. Taking intoaccount relative population size, that rank drops to 62nd.

Capacity vs. Contribution

Pakistan hosted the highest number of refugees - mainly from Afghanistan - compared to its national economy. It hosted 552 refugees per 1 USD of GDP.

Ethiopia was second hosting 303 refugees per 1 USD, followed by Kenya (301), South Sudan (209), Chad (200) and The Democratic Republic of Congo (153).

The first developed country was Germany at 31st place hosting 15 refugees per 1 USD of GDP.

Australia hosted 0.7 refugees per 1 USD of GDP per capita, ranking it 77th in the world.
