

Some of the challenges and their effects faced by people seeking asylum and refugees.








<u>Understanding the challenges of a new education system for people</u> <u>seeking asylum and refugees.</u>

Other ways to support students

Studying in a new education system requires extensive support to achieve successful outcomes. Possible avenues to consider are:

- Provide support for students who have missed their enrolment times. Provide assistance with online enrolments, such as hard copy enrolment forms which are translated into several languages.
- Provide a pre-training visit to the campus.
- ➤ Provide access to a course advisor to discuss the requirements and expectations of the chosen course.
- > Offer learning support e.g. English skills assistance, one-on-one tutoring.
- Induct students into the library and how to access and utilise resources.
- Provide access to computers and digital literacy classes.
- Build connections:
 - o buddy program with teachers or students to help them become familiar with the system.
 - o introduce them to other students who are seeking asylum or from refugee backgrounds.
- ➤ Discuss classroom expectations, behaviours and classroom interactions with the opposite gender.
- Monitor attendance. Follow up absences and provide assistance if required.
- ➤ Build cross-cultural understanding. Include them in social activities to help with integration into campus life.
